Who are we?

The School of Languages is a government school established in 1986 to enhance access, choice and continuity in language learning for South Australian learners, through the provision of quality programs in a broad range of languages R–12, that complement and supplement languages programs offered in mainstream schools and ethnic schools.

In 2013 we offer 24 languages to students from both government and non-government schools.

Why study a language?

Who can study a language with the School of Languages?

- School aged students
- Adult re-entry students (under the age of 21)
- Adult students enrolling in Kurna or Pitjantjatjara—all ages

What courses are on offer?

Years R - 7

We currently offer these year levels in French, Indonesian, Italian, Khmer and Spanish languages.

Years 8 - 10

These courses meet the needs of both second language learners and students with some background knowledge.

SACE Beginners Level Stages 1 and 2

These courses are designed for students who are in years 10, 11 and 12; and have little or no knowledge of the language.

SACE Continuers Level Stages 1 and 2

Courses at this level are designed for students who have achieved Year 10 level or equivalent for entry into SACE Stage 1; or have achieved SACE Stage 1 level for entry into SACE Stage 2.

SACE Background Speakers Level Stages 1 and 2

These courses are for students with a cultural and linguistic background in the language.

SACE Integrated Learning and Language and Culture Stages 1 and 2

Dari language is available through the Integrated Learning. Dinka and Swahili are available through the Language and Culture course.

SACE Australian Languages Stages 1 and 2

The Kurna and Pitjantjatjara courses are part of the Australian Languages Curriculum Statement. These programs cater for those students who have no background in the language and for those who have some.

International Baccalaureate Diploma courses

Ab Initio and Language B courses are available to students enrolled in IB registered schools. Enrolment into these courses are arranged by negotiation between the IB registered school and the School of Languages.
